### TONIGHT'S MATCHUP

The defending Eastern Conference champion Tampa Bay Lightning open the 2015-16 campaign against the Philadelphia Flyers on Opening Night...The Lightning went 2-1-0 against the Flyers in 2014-15, including a 4-3 victory in the lone meeting at Amalie Arena on Oct. 30, 2014...The two teams split a pair of games at Philly's Wells Fargo Center...Lightning captain **Steven Stamkos** was the top goal scorer for the Bolts against the Flyers a season ago, netting four and adding an assist...Finnish forward **Valtteri Filppula** tallied four assists and had a goal in three games against the Flyers during the 2014-15 season...Despite winning two of three from Philadelphia last season, the Flyers outscored the Bolts 11-10...The Lightning were 4-for-12 on the power play vs. Philadelphia in 2014-15; the Flyers went 4-for-9 on the power play...Tampa Bay has won six of its last seven games against Philadelphia dating back to the 2012-13 season and 13 of its last 17 dating back to the 2010-11 season...The Lightning have gone 8-0-1 against the Flyers at Amalie Arena since the beginning of the 2010-11 season, outscoring the Flyers 35-16 during that stretch.

### TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

Tampa Bay will raise the banner from its Eastern Conference championship tonight against Philadelphia...The Lightning are coming off one of the best seasons in team history after setting franchise marks for wins (50), points (108) and goals (259) during the 2014-15 regular season and advancing to the Stanley Cup Final before losing in six games to the Chicago Blackhawks...Tampa Bay defeated Detroit in seven games in the first round, Montreal in six in the second round and the New York Rangers in seven games in the Eastern Conference Final to advance to the Cup Final...The Lightning return tonight to Amalie Arena, where they set a franchise record for wins (32) and owned the NHL's best home record (32-8-1) during the 2014-15 regular season...If Bolts forward **Erik Condra** plays tonight, he will reach game No. 300 for his NHL career.

### PRESEASON

Tampa Bay went 3-3-1 during the preseason with wins in its final two games vs. Dallas (3-2 on Thurs., Oct. 1) and at Florida (3-2 on Sat., Oct. 3)...The Lightning were 2-0-1 at Amalie Arena and outscored opponents 9-6 in home preseason games...Second year pro **Jonathan Drouin** finished tied for third in the preseason for goals (4) and points (8)...**Brian Boyle** (2 goals, 2 assists), **Vladislav Namestnikov** (2,2) and **Erik Condra** (2,2) each finished tied for second on the Bolts behind Drouin for preseason points with 4.

### STAMMER TIME

Lightning Captain **Steven Stamkos** amassed 72 points during the 2014-15 regular season to finish in a first-place tie with **C Tyler Johnson** for most on the Bolts and tied for 14th in the NHL...Stamkos, 25, led the Lightning for goals (43) last season and was second in the NHL behind only Washington's **Alex Ovechkin** (53)...Stamkos reached the 40-goal plateau for the 4th time in his career...Stamkos ranked tied for 6th in the league for power-play regular-season goals (13), and was tied for 1st (Tyler Johnson) on the Lightning for game-winning goals (6)...With 498 career points currently, Stamkos sits just two shy of 500...Stamkos is eight games away from playing in his 500th NHL game, a mark he should reach Oct. 23 at Winnipeg...Stamkos has the third-most game-winning goals in the NHL since 2010-11, trailing only Washington's Alex Ovechkin (39) and Anaheim's Corey Perry (34).

### BISH PLEASE

Lightning goaltender **Ben Bishop** is scheduled to make his second-straight and second-ever Opening Night start for the Bolts tonight. Bishop, 28, stopped 19-of-21 shots a year ago on Opening Night vs. Florida at Amalie Arena to get the win in Tampa Bay's 3-2 overtime victory...Bishop went 27-6-1 at Amalie Arena to go along with a 2.15 goals-against average and .925 save percentage...Bishop appeared in 25 postseason games, compiling a 13-11 record, a 2.18 goals-against average and .921 save percentage...Bishop's 13 wins ranked tied for 1st in the NHL postseason, and he led all goalies for playoff shutouts with three, including twice in winner-take-all Game 7s (vs. Detroit in first round and at New York Rangers in Eastern Conference Final)...Bishop won 40 games last season, breaking his own franchise mark he set in 2013-14 (37 wins)...Bishop's 40 regular-season wins ranked 4th in the NHL.

## JOHNNY BE GOOD

**Tyler Johnson's** 72 regular-season points were tied with **Steven Stamkos** for most on the Lightning in 2014-15...Johnson, 25, ranked second on the Bolts for goals (29) and assists (43)...Johnson was named to the NHL All-Star Game on Jan. 10 but was forced to miss the game with a lower-body injury...Johnson owned the NHL's third-best plus/minus rating at +33...He was the only undrafted player among the Top 20 point scorers in the NHL last season and was one of only two players (**PavelSKI**, San Jose) that wasn't a first round selection in the Top 20 for points...Johnson set a new Lightning franchise record for postseason goals in a single year with 13, which paced the NHL...His 23 playoff points were tied with Chicago's **Patrick Kane** for most in the league...Johnson became the first Bolt to record a playoff hat trick (Game 2 Eastern Conference Final at the New York Rangers).

## HED OF THE CLASS

**Victor Hedman** is coming off a phenomenal postseason in which he lead the team in TOI (23:57) and blocked shots (47)...Hedman's +11 playoff rating was second-best in the NHL...The Swede scored 1 goal and had 14 assists in 26 postseason games...Hedman, 24, led all Bolts defensemen with 10 goals despite missing 18 games with a broken finger (10/20-11/26).

## REUNITED

Lightning defensemen **Matt Carle** and **Braydon Coburn** will be playing against their former team when the Flyers visit Amalie Arena tonight. Carle spent parts of four seasons in Philadelphia (2008-12) and played in 308 games with the Flyers. Coburn was dealt to the Lightning on trade deadline day (March 2, 2015) last season in exchange for D **Radko Gudas** and the Lightning's 2015 first- and third-round picks in the NHL Draft. Coburn spent parts of nine seasons in Philadelphia (2007-15) and played in 576 games with the Flyers. Radko Gudas returns to Amalie Arena for the first time since being traded to Philadelphia in the deal that brought Coburn to Tampa Bay. Gudas hasn't played since undergoing surgery for a right knee injury early January 2015 and has yet to suit up for the Flyers.

## NOTEWORTHY

Tampa Bay has won 4 of its last 5 season openers and 3 straight at home...Not including the 2008-09 season opener in Prague, Czech Republic, technically considered a home game, the Lightning have won their last six season openers at home...Tampa Bay is 13-7 with 2 ties in season openers all-time...In season openers at home, the Lightning are 9-3 with two ties...The Lightning have never opened the season against Philadelphia...Tampa Bay began the 2014-15 season with wins in 11 of its first 15 games...The Lightning will play 11 of their first 16 games on the road to start the 2015-16 season...With renovations to Amalie Arena during the offseason, official capacity is now 19,092 (previously 19,204).

# Tampa Bay Lightning: Head Coach and Player Bios

## Head Coach: Jon Cooper

Cooper was named the franchise's eighth head coach on March 26, 2013.

Cooper, 48, begins his fourth season behind the Lightning bench and has amassed a 100-59-20 record entering the 2015-16 season. Cooper's .615 win percentage is the highest in franchise history. He earned career NHL victory No. 100 on April 11, 2015, making him the fifth-fastest coach among those who debuted in the league since 2000 to reach that mark. He has led the Lightning to the Stanley Cup Playoffs in each of his two full seasons as head coach, including a trip to the Stanley Cup Final in 2015. He was named a finalist for the Jack Adams Award in 2014, given annually to the NHL's top coach. Cooper joined the Lightning after spending the previous three seasons behind the bench of Tampa Bay's top minor league affiliates, the Norfolk Admirals (2010-12) and the Syracuse Crunch (2012-13), compiling a record of 133-62-26 (.661) in 221 AHL games. Cooper's NHL head coaching debut came with the Lightning on March 29, 2013.

### **SEASON/ROAD OPENERS**

The Flyers are opening the season on the road for the second consecutive year. Last year they opened up in Boston, dropping a 2-1 decision. This is the first time the Flyers have ever opened their season against the Lightning and is also the first time they've opened the year in the state of Florida at all. The previous southern-most opener in Flyers history was the 2009-10 opener, which was a 2-0 win at Carolina.

The Flyers have lost three consecutive opening night games – 3-1 at home vs. PIT in 2012-13 and 3-1 at home vs. TOR in 2013-14, in addition to last year. Prior to that, they had won three opening night games in a row. The Flyers are 21-19-7 all-time in season openers.

The Flyers have also dropped three consecutive road openers – last year's at Boston, along with a 4-1 setback at Montreal in 2013-14 and a 5-2 loss in Buffalo in 2012-13. Prior to that, the Flyers had gone 4-0-1 in the previous five seasons of road openers. This is the farthest south the Flyers have come for the first road game of the season since starting their away schedule in Atlanta in the 1979-80 and 1976-77 seasons. The Flyers are 20-16-11 all-time in road openers.

This is the third time in the last five seasons that the Flyers have served as the opponent for multiple home openers on their first road trip. They did so at the start of the shortened 2012-13 season, when after opening at home they went to New Jersey (3-0 L) and then to Buffalo (5-2 L). The season before, the Flyers did the same thing and swept both games, winning 2-1 at Boston before going to New Jersey and beating the Devils 3-0. That season's win over Boston was the last time the Flyers have been an opening night opponent for a team raising a banner before the game.

This is the first of three meetings between the two clubs this season. The other two meetings will take place over the course of a week in March; for the Flyers, it's a home-and-home situation, but the Lightning take on the Bruins between the two games.

## TAMPA BAY NOTABLES

The Flyers' 7-3 win over Tampa Bay last January 12 snapped a six-game losing streak against the club. The Flyers are 4-12-1 vs. Tampa Bay since the start of the 2010-11 season. Prior to that, the Flyers had a record of 39-22-8-2 from the Lightning's inception in 1992 through the end of the 2009-10 season.

**John LeClair** is the only Flyer ever to record a hat trick against Tampa Bay, doing so three times between 1995 and 2000.

**Roman Cechmanek** was the last Flyer to shut out Tampa Bay. He did so three times over the course of 11 months – 1/12/01, 2/24/01 and 12/1/01.

The Flyers held Tampa Bay without a shot in the second period of a game on Nov. 22, 1999, marking the only period in Flyers history the opponent has not had at least one shot.

Tonight's game marks the first game for **Radko Gudas** and **Braydon Coburn** against their former clubs since they were traded for each other last March 2. If Gudas dresses tonight, it would also mark his Flyers debut. He missed the remaining time on last season following the trade due to a knee injury. Coburn played four regular season games and 26 playoff games for the Lightning last year. He played nine seasons for the Flyers, recording 37 goals and 124 assists for 161 points in 576 games.

## DEBUTS

The Flyers have several players making team or NHL debuts tonight. It's the NHL debut for 33-year-old defenseman **Evgeny Medvedev**, who came to the Flyers in the offseason from the KHL. Whenever they first dress, **Sam Gagner**, **Radko Gudas** and **Michal Neuvirth** will be making their Flyers debuts. Both **Brandon Manning** and **Scott Laughton** have played for the Flyers before, but this season is the first time either player has made the opening night roster.

Tonight also marks the first NHL game for new Flyers head coach **Dave Hakstol**, who was named the 19<sup>th</sup> head coach in team history on May 18. He comes to Philadelphia from the University of North Dakota, where he led the men's hockey team to 11 NCAA tournaments and seven Frozen Fours in 11 years at the helm. Hakstol compiled a record of 289-143-43 in 475 games as UND's head coach, including a record of 29-10-3 last year. He had coached at his alma mater a total of 15 seasons, serving four years as an assistant to Dean Blais before taking the head job in 2004. Hakstol's program has produced 20 NHL players, including Jonathan Toews (CHI), Matt Greene (LAK), T.J. Oshie (STL), Travis Zajac (NJD), Drew Stafford (BUF, WPG) and Chris VandeVelde (EDM, PHI). A total of 46 of his players have played professionally at some level. He had seven Hobey Baker Award finalists, including 2007 winner Ryan Duncan, and had 11 All-Americans.

Mason had the lowest full-season GAA for a Flyers goaltender since 2003-04, when Robert Esche finished the year with a 2.04 GAA. His 5-on-5 save percentage was the best in the NHL last year (.944) and his GAA in that situation of 1.73 was second-best in the league, behind only Carey Price (1.67).

The Flyers had the league's best power play in the preseason, going 10-for-30 (33.3 pct). Last season the unit was third-best in the NHL at 23.4 percent. On home ice, the Flyers set a new franchise high of 28.0 percent, breaking the club's previous high of 27.8 pct set in 2012-13 that covered seasons from 1982-83 until now. (Home/road power play splits were first kept in 1982; Flyers team percentages prior to that were not available.)



## Philadelphia Flyers: Head Coach and Player Bios

### Head Coach: Dave Hakstol

Dave Hakstol was named the 19th head coach in Flyers history on May 18, 2015.

Hakstol, 47 (7/30/1968), comes to the Flyers from the University of North Dakota, where he served as the head coach of the school's hockey program for 11 seasons. During that time, Hakstol's teams posted an overall record of 289-143-43 (.654). The Warburg, Alberta native led UND to the NCAA postseason in each of his 11 seasons, including seven appearances in the NCAA Frozen Four, most of any program in the country during that span.

North Dakota won three regular-season conference titles under Hakstol (WCHA 2008-09 and 2010-11; NCHC 2014-15). He also led UND to four WCHA playoff titles (05-06, 09-10, 10-11 and 11-12).

46 of Hakstol's players at UND played professionally in 2014-15 and 20 played in the NHL, including Jonathan Toews of the Chicago Blackhawks and Matt Greene of the Los Angeles Kings. UND produced a total of 42 NHL draft picks during Hakstol's tenure, including eight first-round picks.
